21	FINDINGS OF FACT		
22	1. On or about March 5, 2014, Complainant Patrick Dorais, in his official capacity as		
23	the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed Accusation		
24	No. 79/14-100 against Nicholas J. Baca (Respondent) before the Director of Consumer Affairs.		
25	(Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)		
26	2. On or about July 29, 2013, the Bureau of Automotive Repair (Bureau) issued Smog		
27	Check Inspector License No. E0631138 to Respondent. The Smog Check Inspector License was		
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in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 79/14-100 and will expire on April 30, 2015, unless renewed.

- 3. On or about July 29, 2013, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check Repair Technician License No. EI631138 to Respondent. The Smog Check Repair Technician License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 79/14-100 and will expire on April 30, 2015, unless renewed.
- 4. On or about June 30, 2009, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA631138 to Respondent. The Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License expired on April 30, 2013, and has not been renewed. This lapse in licensure, however, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 118(b) does not deprive the Bureau of authority to institute or continue this disciplinary proceeding.
- 5. On or about March 10, 2014, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 79/14-100, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 136, is required to be reported and maintained with the Bureau. Respondent's address of record was and is:

- 6. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
  - 7. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
  - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.

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- 8. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 79/14-100.
  - 9. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
  - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 10. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Director after having reviewed the proof of service dated March 10, 2014, signed by Celia Cruz, finds Respondent is in default. The Director will take action without further hearing and, based on Accusation No. 79/14-100, proof of service and on the Affidavit of Bureau Representative Douglas Brown, finds that the allegations in Accusation are true.
- 11. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$2,480.00 as of July 10, 2014.

#### **DETERMINATION OF ISSUES**

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Nicholas J. Baca has subjected his Smog Check Inspector License No. E0631138, his Smog Check Repair Technician License No. E1631138, and his Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA631138 to discipline.
  - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Director of Consumer Affairs is authorized to revoke Respondent's Smog Check Inspector License based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the affidavit of Bureau Representative Douglas Brown in this case.:
- a. Respondent's technician licenses are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about August 15, 2013, regarding the Bureau's 2007 Jeep, Respondent violated sections of that Code as follows:

DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER

#### **ORDER**

IT IS SO ORDERED that Smog Check Inspector License No. EO631138, Smog Check Repair Technician License No. EI631138, and Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA631138, heretofore issued to Respondent Nicholas J. Baca, are revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The motion should be sent to the Bureau of Automotive Repair, ATTN: William D. Thomas, 10949 North Mather Blvd., Rancho Cordova, CA 95670. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

This Decision shall become effective on Wy 10, 20,4.

21	1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as the Chief of the		
22	Bureau of Automotive Repair ("Bureau"), Department of Consumer Affairs.		
23	2. On or about June 30, 2009, the Bureau issued Advanced Emission Specialist		
24	Technician License Number EA 631138 to Nicholas J. Baca ("Respondent"). The Advanced		
25	Emission Specialist Technician License expired on April 30, 2013. Pursuant to California Code		
26	of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), the license was renewed pursuant to		
27	Respondent's election, as Smog Check Inspector License No. EO 631138, effective April 30,		
28	2013, and Smog Check Repair Technician License No. EI 631138, effective July 29, 2013

("technician licenses"). Respondent's technician licenses will expire on April 30, 2015, unless renewed. **JURISDICTION** 3. Health and Safety Code section 44002 provides, in pertinent part, that the Director has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program. Health and Safety Code section 44072.6 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director of Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action. 5. Health and Safety Code section 44072.8 states that, "When a license has been revoked or suspended following a hearing under this article, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of the licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the director." 6. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.28, subdivision (e), states that "[u]pon renewal of an unexpired Basic Area Technician license or an Advanced Emission Specialist Technician license issued prior to the effective date of this regulation, the license may apply to renew as a Smog Check Inspector, Smog Check Repair Technician, or both." STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS 7. Business and Professions Code ("Code") section 22, subdivision (a), states: "Board," as used in any provision of this code, refers to the board in which the administration of the provision is vested, and unless otherwise expressly provided, shall include "bureau," "commission," "committee," "department," "division," "examining committee," "program," and "agency." 8. Code section 477 provides, in pertinent part, that ABoard@ includes Abureau,@ Acommission,@ Acommittee,@ Adepartment,@ Adivision,@ Aexamining committee,@ Aprogram,@ <sup>1</sup> Effective August 1, 2012, California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 3340.28, 3340.29, and 3340.30 were amended to implement a license restructure from the Advanced Emission Specialist Technician (EA) license and Basic Area (EB) Technician license to Smog Check Inspector (EO) license and/or Smog Check Repair Technician (E1) license.

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Accusation

- 14. The Bureau obtained information from the vehicle information database ("VID") showing that Respondent performed a smog inspection on the 2007 Jeep on August 15, 2013, between 10:12 and 10:26 hours, resulting in the issuance of electronic smog Certificate of Compliance No. OY537875C.
- 15. The Bureau determined that the certificate of compliance was issued illegally because an aftermarket performance chip device modification installed on the 2007 Jeep had not been removed during the smog inspection, which precluded the vehicle from passing a lawful smog inspection.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

- 16. Respondent's technician licenses are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (a), in that on or about August 15, 2013, regarding the Bureau's 2007 Jeep, Respondent violated sections of that Code as follows:
- a. <u>Section 44012, subdivision (f)</u>: Respondent failed to perform on the vehicle a visual and/or functional check of the emission control devices in accordance with required procedures.
- b. <u>Section 44032</u>: Respondent failed to perform tests of the emission control devices and systems on the vehicle in accordance with Code section 44012, in that the vehicle had an aftermarket performance chip device installed, which had not been removed.

### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with Regulations Pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program)

- 17. Respondent's technician licenses are subject to discipline pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.2, subdivision (c), in that on or about August 15, 2013, regarding the Bureau's 2007 Jeep, Respondent failed to comply with provisions of California Code of Regulations, title 16, as follows:
- a. <u>Section 3340.30, subdivision (a)</u>: Respondent failed to inspect and test the vehicle in accordance with Health and Safety Code section 44012.
- b. <u>Section 3341.41, subdivision (c)</u>: Respondent knowingly entered false information into the emission inspection system.

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c. <u>Section 3340.42</u>: Respondent failed to conduct the required smog tests on the vehicle in accordance with the Bureau's specifications.

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## **MATTERS IN AGGRAVATION**

- 18. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent, Complainant alleges as follows:
- a. On or about October 7, 2010, the Bureau issued Citation No. M2011-0413 against Respondent's Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA 631138 for violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program. On September 29, 2009, Respondent issued a certificate of compliance to a Bureau undercover vehicle with a missing positive crankcase ventilation system. Respondent was directed to complete an 8 hour training course and to submit proof of completion to the Bureau within 30 days from receipt of the citation. Respondent completed the training on December 3, 2010.
- b. On or about February 4, 2011, the Bureau issued Citation No. M2011-0872 against Respondent's Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA 631138 for violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program. On January 19, 2011, Respondent issued a certificate of compliance to a Bureau undercover vehicle with a missing thermostatic air cleaner hot air tube. Respondent was directed to complete a 16 hour training course and submit proof of completion to the Bureau 30 days from receipt of citation. Respondent completed the training on March 28, 2011.
- c. On or about June 26, 2012, the Bureau issued Citation No. M2012-1854 against Respondent's Advanced Emission Specialist Technician License No. EA 631138 for violations of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Program. Respondent was directed to complete a 68 hour Basic Clean Air Car Course and submit proof of completion to the Bureau 60 days from receipt of citation. Respondent appealed the citation and a hearing on the matter was held on January 28, 2014. On February 14, 2014, a Decision was issued effective March 26, 2014, denying Respondent's appeal and upholding the citation.

# **OTHER MATTERS** 19. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if the Smog Check Inspector (EO) License No. 631138 or the Smog Check Repair Technician (EI) License No. 631138 issued to Nicholas J. Baca is revoked or suspended, any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the Director. PRAYER WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision: 1. Revoking or suspending Nicholas J. Baca's Smog Check Inspector License No. EO 631138; 2. Revoking or suspending Nicholas J. Baca's Smog Check Repair Technician License No. EI 631138; 3. Revoking or suspending any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of Nicholas J. Baca; 2. Ordering Nicholas J. Baca to pay the Bureau of Automotive Repair the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and, 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
