8 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
9 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

10 **PARTIES**

11 1. Patrick Dorais (Complainant) is the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair
12 (Bureau). He brought this action solely in his official capacity and is represented in this matter by
13 Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Stephanie J. Lee, Deputy
14 Attorney General.

15 2. Respondent Frank Ramirez (Respondent Ramirez) and Respondent Ducki Hahn
16 (Respondent Hahn) are each represented in this proceeding by attorney Lawrence Adamsky,
17 whose address is: 9701 Wilshire Blvd., Ste 1000, Beverly Hills, California 90212-2010.

18 **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 146465**

19 3. In 2004, the Bureau issued Advanced Emission Specialist (EA) Technician License
20 No. 146465 to Frank Ramirez (Respondent Ramirez) under SB 1997, the biennial Smog Check
21 Program implemented January 1, 1990. EA License No. 146465 was due to expire on December
22 31, 2012, however, it was cancelled on November 13, 2012. On or about November 13, 2012, the
23 Bureau issued Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 146465 to Respondent Ramirez.¹ The
24 Smog Check Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges
25 brought herein and will expire on December 31, 2020, unless renewed.

27 ¹ Effective August 1, 2012, an Amendment to Sections 3340.28, 3340.29 and 3340.30, of Article
28 2, Chapter 1, Division 33, Title 16, CCR implemented a License restructure of Smog Check Technician
(EA/EB) license types to Smog Check Inspector (EO) license and Smog Check Repair Technician (EI)
license.

1 **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 634240**

2 4. On or about May 2, 2012, EA Technician License No. 634240 was issued to Ducki
3 Hahn (Respondent Hahn) under the SB 1997, the biennial Smog Check Program implemented
4 January 1, 1990. EA License No. 634240 was due to expire on February 28, 2014, however it
5 was cancelled on February 26, 2014. Pursuant to Cal. Code of Regs., title 16 section 3340.28,
6 subdivision (e), said license was renewed pursuant to Respondent Hahn's election as Smog Check
7 Inspector (EO) License No. 634240, effective February 26, 2014. The Smog Check Inspector
8 License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
9 expire on February 29, 2020, unless renewed.

10 **JURISDICTION**

11 5. Accusation No. 79/17-9237 was filed before the Director, and is currently pending
12 against Respondents. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly
13 served on Respondents on January 30, 2019. Respondents timely filed their Notice of Defense
14 contesting the Accusation.

15 6. A copy of Accusation No. 79/17-9237 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated
16 herein by reference.

17 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

18 7. Respondents have carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understand the
19 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 79/17-9237. Respondents have also carefully read,
20 fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and
21 Disciplinary Order.

22 8. Respondents are fully aware of their legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
23 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine
24 the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on its own behalf; the right
25 to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of
26 documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other
27 rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

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1 Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a
2 writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

3 15. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
4 the Director may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following
5 Disciplinary Order:

6 **DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

7 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 146465** issued to
8 Respondent Ramirez and **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 634240** issued to
9 Respondent Hahn are revoked. However, the revocations are stayed and Respondents are placed
10 on probation for three (3) years on the following terms and conditions.

11 1. **Obey All Laws.** During the period of probation, Respondents shall comply with all
12 federal and state statutes, regulations and rules governing all BAR registrations and licenses held
13 by Respondents.

14 2. **Quarterly Reporting.** During the period of probation, Respondents shall report
15 either by personal appearance or in writing as determined by BAR on a schedule set by BAR, but
16 no more frequently than once each calendar quarter, on the methods used and success achieved in
17 maintaining compliance with the terms and conditions of probation.

18 3. **Report Financial Interests.** Respondents shall, within 30 days of the effective date
19 of the decision and within 30 days from the date of any request by BAR during the period of
20 probation, report any financial interest which any Respondents or any partners, officers, or
21 owners of any Respondent facility may have in any other business required to be registered
22 pursuant to Section 9884.6 of the Business and Professions Code.

23 4. **Access to Examine Vehicles and Records.** Respondents shall provide BAR
24 representatives unrestricted access to examine all vehicles (including parts) undergoing service,
25 inspection, or repairs, up to and including the point of completion. Respondents shall also provide
26 BAR representatives unrestricted access to all records pursuant to BAR laws and regulations.

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1 **5. Tolling of Probation.** If, during probation, Respondents leave the jurisdiction of
2 California to reside or do business elsewhere or otherwise ceases to do business in the jurisdiction
3 of California, Respondents shall notify BAR in writing within 10 days of the dates of departure
4 and return, and of the dates of cessation and resumption of business in California. All provisions
5 of probation other than cost reimbursement requirements, restitution requirements, training
6 requirements, and that Respondents obey all laws, shall be held in abeyance during any period of
7 time of 30 days or more in which Respondents are not residing or engaging in business within the
8 jurisdiction of California. All provisions of probation shall recommence on the effective date of
9 resumption of business in California. Any period of time of 30 days or more in which
10 Respondents are not residing or engaging in business within the jurisdiction of California shall
11 not apply to the reduction of this probationary period or to any period of actual suspension not
12 previously completed. Tolling is not available if business or work relevant to the probationary
13 license or registration is conducted or performed during the tolling period.

14 **6. Violation of Probation.** If Respondents violate or fail to comply with the terms and
15 conditions of probation in any respect, the Director, after giving notice and opportunity to be
16 heard may set aside the stay order and carry out the disciplinary order provided in the decision.
17 Once Respondents are served notice of BAR's intent to set aside the stay, the Director shall
18 maintain jurisdiction, and the period of probation shall be extended until final resolution of the
19 matter.

20 **7. Maintain Valid License.** Respondents shall, at all times while on probation,
21 maintain a current and active registration and/or license(s) with BAR, including any period during
22 which suspension or probation is tolled. If Respondents' registration or license is expired at the
23 time the decision becomes effective, the registration or license must be renewed by Respondents
24 within 30 days of that date. If Respondents' registration or license expires during a term of
25 probation, by operation of law or otherwise, then upon renewal Respondents' registration or
26 license shall be subject to any and all terms and conditions of probation not previously satisfied.
27 Failure to maintain a current and active registration and/or license during the period of probation
28 shall also constitute a violation of probation.

1 8. **Cost Recovery.** Respondents shall each pay the Bureau of Automotive Repair
2 \$2,007.06 for the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of case No. 79/17-9237.
3 Respondents shall make such respective payments as follows: the total costs shall be paid in six
4 (6) equal monthly payments, with the first payment due within thirty (30) days of the effective
5 date of the Decision and Order. Respondents shall make payment by check or money order
6 payable to the Bureau of Automotive Repair and shall indicate on the check or money order that it
7 is for cost recovery payment for case No. 79/17-9237. Any order for payment of cost recovery
8 shall remain in effect whether or not probation is tolled. Probation shall not terminate until full
9 cost recovery payment has been made. BAR reserves the right to pursue any other lawful
10 measures in collecting on the costs ordered and past due, in addition to taking action based upon
11 the violation of probation.

12 9. **Completion of Probation.** Upon successful completion of probation, Respondents'
13 affected licenses will be fully restored or issued without restriction, if Respondents meets all
14 current requirements for registration or licensure and has paid all outstanding fees, monetary
15 penalties, or cost recovery owed to BAR.

16 10. **License Surrender.** Following the effective date of a decision that orders a stay of
17 invalidation or revocation, if Respondents cease business operations or is otherwise unable to
18 satisfy the terms and conditions of probation, Respondents may request that the stay be vacated.
19 Such request shall be made in writing to BAR. The Director and the BAR Chief reserve the right
20 to evaluate the Respondents' request and to exercise discretion whether to grant the request or
21 take any other action deemed appropriate or reasonable under the circumstances. Upon formal
22 granting of the request, the Director will vacate the stay order and carry out the disciplinary order
23 provided in the decision. Respondents may not petition the Director for reinstatement of the
24 surrendered registration and/or license, or apply for a new registration or license under the
25 jurisdiction of BAR at any time before the date of the originally scheduled completion of
26 probation. If Respondents apply to BAR for a registration or license at any time after that date,
27 Respondents must meet all current requirements for registration or licensure and pay all
28 outstanding fees or cost recovery owed to BAR and left outstanding at the time of surrender.

1 11. **Actual Suspension.** Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 634240 issued to
2 Respondent Ducki Hahn is suspended for ninety (90) consecutive days beginning on the effective
3 date of the Decision and Order.

4 12. **Training Course.** During the period of probation, each Respondent shall attend and
5 successfully complete a 68-hour BAR-specified and -approved training course in inspection,
6 diagnosis and/or repair of emission systems failures and engine performance, applicable to the
7 class of license held by the Respondent. Each Respondent shall provide to the Bureau proof of
8 enrollment in the course within 30 days of the effective date of the decision, and proof of
9 successful course completion within 180 days of the effective date of the decision. Failure to
10 provide proof of enrollment and/or successful course completion to the Bureau within the
11 timeframes specified shall constitute a violation of probation, and Respondent shall be prohibited
12 from issuing any certificate of compliance or noncompliance until such proof is received.

13 13. **Notification to Employer.** When performing services that fall within the scope of
14 their license, Respondents shall provide each of their current or future employers a copy of the
15 decision and the underlying Accusation or Statement of Issues before commencing employment.
16 Notification to Respondent's current employer shall occur no later than the effective date of the
17 decision. Respondents shall submit to BAR, upon request, satisfactory evidence of compliance
18 with this term of probation.

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1 ACCEPTANCE

2 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order and have fully
3 discussed it with my attorney, Lawrence Adamsky. I understand the stipulation and the effect it
4 will have on my Smog Check Inspector License. I enter into this Stipulated Settlement and

10 **PARTIES**

11 1. Patrick Dorais (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity as
12 the Chief of the Bureau of Automotive Repair, Department of Consumer Affairs.

13 **Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 275916**

14 2. On or about March 19, 2014, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Automotive
15 Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD 275916 to Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test,
16 Dong U. Lee, President (Respondent New Star Smog). The Automotive Repair Dealer
17 Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and
18 expired on March 31, 2018.

19 **Smog Check Test Only Station License Number TC 275916**

20 3. On or about April 7, 2014, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check,
21 Test Only, Station License Number TC 275916 to Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test, Dong
22 U. Lee, President (Respondent New Car Smog). The Smog Check, Test Only, Station License
23 was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and expired on
24 March 31, 2018.

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1 **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 146465**

2 4. In 2004, the Bureau issued Advanced Emission Specialist (EA) Technician License
3 No. 146465 to Frank Ramirez (Respondent Ramirez) under SB 1997, the biennial Smog Check

10 5. On or about June 6, 2013, the Bureau of Automotive Repair issued Smog Check
11 Inspector License Number EO 635598 to Oscar Contreras (Respondent Contreras). The Smog
12 Check Inspector License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
13 herein and will expire on October 31, 2019, unless renewed.

14 **Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 634240**

15 6. On or about May 2, 2012, EA Technician License No. 634240 was issued to Ducki
16 Hahn (Respondent Hahn) under the SB 1997, the biennial Smog Check Program implemented
17 January 1, 1990. EA License No. 634240 was due to expire on February 28, 2014, however it
18 was cancelled on February 26, 2014. Pursuant to Cal. Code of Regs., title 16 section 3340.28,
19 subdivision (e), said license was renewed pursuant to Respondent Hahn's election as Smog Check
20 Inspector (EO) License No. 634240, effective February 26, 2014. The Smog Check Inspector
21 License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
22 expire on February 29, 2020, unless renewed.

1 **JURISDICTION**

2 7. Business and Professions Code section 9884.13 provides, in pertinent part, that the
3 expiration of a valid registration shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a
4 disciplinary proceeding against an automotive repair dealer or to render a decision temporarily or
5 permanently invalidating (suspending or revoking) a registration.

6 8. Health and Safety Code section 44002 provides, in pertinent part, that the Director
7 has all the powers and authority granted under the Automotive Repair Act for enforcing the
8 Motor Vehicle Inspection Program.

9 9. Health and Safety Code section 44072.6 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration
10 or suspension of a license by operation of law, or by order or decision of the Director of
11 Consumer Affairs, or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the
12 Director of jurisdiction to proceed with disciplinary action.

13 10. Health and Safety Code section 44072.2(a) provides, in pertinent part, the director
14 may suspend, revoke, or take other disciplinary action against a license as provided in this article
15 if the licensee, or any partner, officer, or director thereof violates any section of this chapter and
16 the regulations adopted pursuant to it, which related to the licensed activities.”

17
18 **STATUTORY PROVISIONS**

19 11. Section 477 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that “Board” includes “bureau,”
20 “commission,” “committee,” “department,” “division,” “examining committee,” “program,” and
21 “agency.” “License” includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or
22 profession regulated by the Code.

23 12. Section 9884.7 of the Code states:

24 “(a) The director, where the automotive repair dealer cannot show there was a bona fide
25 error, may deny, suspend, revoke, or place on probation the registration of an automotive repair
26 dealer for any of the following acts or omissions related to the conduct of the business of the
27 automotive repair dealer, which are done by the automotive repair dealer or any automotive
28 technician, employee, partner, officer, or member of the automotive repair dealer.

1 (1) Making or authorizing in any manner or by any means whatever any statement written
2 or oral which is untrue or misleading, and which is known, or which by the exercise of reasonable
3 care should be known, to be untrue or misleading.

4 ...

5 (4) Any other conduct which constitutes fraud.

6 ...

7 (6) Failure in any material respect to comply with the provisions of this chapter or
8 regulations adopted pursuant to it.”

9 13. Section 9889.22 of the BPC states:

10 “The willful making of any false statement or entry with regard to a material matter in any
11 oath, affidavit, certificate of compliance or noncompliance, or application form which is required
12 by this chapter or Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 44000) of Part 5 of Division 26 of the
13 Health and Safety Code constitutes perjury and is punishable as provided in the Penal Code.

14 14. Section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code states:

15 “The test at the smog check stations shall be performed in accordance with procedures
16 prescribed by the department, pursuant to Section 44013, shall require, at a minimum, loaded
17 mode dynamometer testing in enhanced areas, and two-speed testing in all other program areas,
18 and shall ensure all of the following:

19 ...

20 (f) A visual or functional check is made of emission control devices specified by the
21 department, including the catalytic converter in those instances in which the department
22 determines it to be necessary to meet the findings of Section 44001. The visual or functional
23 check shall be performed in accordance with procedures prescribed by the department.”

24 15. Section 44015(b) of the Health and Safety Code states that [i]f a vehicle meets the
25 requirements of Section 44012, a smog check station licensed to issue certificates shall issue a
26 certificate of compliance or a certificate of noncompliance.

27 16. Section 44032 of the HSC states:

28

1 "No person shall perform, for compensation, tests or repairs of emission control devices or
2 systems of motor vehicles required by this chapter unless the person performing the test or repair
3 is a qualified smog check technician and the test or repair is performed at a licensed smog check
4 station. Qualified technicians shall perform tests of emission control devices and systems in
5 accordance with Section 44012."

6 17. Section 44059 of the Health and Safety Code states:

7 "The willful making of any false statement or entry with regard to a material matter in any
8 oath, affidavit, certificate of compliance or noncompliance, or application form which is required
9 by this chapter or Chapter 20.3 (commencing with Section 9880) of Division 3 of the Business
10 and Professions Code, constitutes perjury and is punishable as provided in the Penal Code."

11 REGULATIONS

12 18. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.30, subdivision (a), states in
13 pertinent part that a licensed smog technician shall at all times "[i]nspect, test and repair vehicles,
14 as applicable, in accordance with section 44012 of the Health & Saf. Code, section 44035 of the
15 Health & Saf. Code, and section 3340.42 of this article."

16 19. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.35(c) states that "[a] licensed
17 station shall issue a certificate of compliance or noncompliance to the owner or operator of any
18 vehicle that has been inspected in accordance with the procedures specified in section 3340.42 of
19 this article and has all the required emission control equipment and devices installed and
20 functioning correctly."

21 20. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3340.41, subdivision (c), states that
22 "[n]o person shall enter into the emissions inspection system any vehicle identification
23 information or emission control system identification data for any vehicle other than the one
24 being tested. Nor shall any person knowingly enter into the emissions inspection system any false
25 information about the vehicle being tested."

26 21. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 3373, states:

27 "No automotive repair dealer or individual in charge shall, in filling out an estimate,
28 invoice, or work order, or record required to be maintained by section 3340.15(f) of this chapter,

1 withhold therefrom or insert therein any statement or information which will cause any such
2 document to be false or misleading, or where the tendency or effect thereby would be to mislead
3 or deceive customers, prospective customers, or the public.”

4 5 COST RECOVERY

6 22. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the
7 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
8 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
9 enforcement of the case.

10 11 VID DATA REVIEW

12 23. On March 9, 2015, the Bureau implemented a policy change requiring the use of an
13 On-Board Diagnostic Inspection System (OIS) in testing of 2000 model year and newer gas
14 powered vehicles 14,000 Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVW) and under, and 1998 and newer
15 diesel powered vehicles 14,000 GVW and under. The OIS Bureau Test Data lists differences in
16 Vehicle Identification Numbers (VIN) for vehicles that have received smog inspections, in
17 addition to communication protocol (the language used to communicate) and Parameter ID (PID)
18 differences with vehicles that have been certified correctly that are the same make and model
19 vehicles.

20 24. On or about June 8, 2017, Bureau representative Mark Casillas initiated an
21 investigation in which he reviewed OIS test data for Respondent New Star Smog. Representative
22 Mark Casillas' investigation revealed that the data related to certain vehicles certified by
23 Respondent New Car Smog contained a pattern of unmistakable discrepancies between the
24 information transmitted during the inspections and documented information known about the
25 subject vehicles. Specifically, representative Mark Casillas compared the data received from the
26 certified vehicles to data from vehicles of the same year, make, and model and determined that
27 the data from twelve of the certified vehicles contained two or more of the following
28 unmistakable discrepancies: (1) missing eVINs; (2) incorrect vehicle communication protocols;

1 and (3) incorrect PID counts. These documented discrepancies confirm that the vehicles receiving
 2 smog certificates from Respondent New Star Smog were fraudulently tested during the smog
 3 inspection using the clean plugging method. Clean plugging refers to the use of another vehicle's
 4 properly functioning On Board Diagnostic, generation II, (OBD II) system, or another source, to
 5 generate passing diagnostic readings for the purpose of issuing fraudulent smog Certificates of
 6 Compliance to vehicles that are not in smog compliance or were not present for testing.

7 25. The following table illustrates the documented clean plugging activities of
 8 Respondents from November 6, 2016 through June 5, 2017.

26. The data analysis conducted on Respondent New Star Smog shows that Respondents participated in a scheme to perform twelve fraudulent Smog Check inspections resulting in the issuance of twelve fraudulent electronic Smog Check Certificates of Compliance.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Untrue or Misleading Statements)

(As to Automotive Repair Dealer Registration No. 275916)

27. Respondent New Star Smog's Automotive Repair Dealer Registration is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 9884.7, subdivision (a)(1), in that Respondent made or authorized statements which Respondent knew or in the exercise of reasonable care should have known to be untrue or misleading.

28. Respondent New Star Smog certified that the twelve vehicles identified in paragraph 25 above, had passed inspection and were in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. In fact, Respondent New Star Smog conducted the inspections of the twelve vehicles identified in paragraph 25 above, using clean-plugging methods in that he substituted or used a different vehicle(s), or another source, or failed to report the results of the vehicles identified during the OBD II functional tests in order to issue smog certificates of compliance for the vehicles. Respondent New Star Smog did not test or inspect any of the twelve vehicles as required by Health and Safety Code section 44012. Complainant incorporates by reference, paragraphs 23 through 26, as if fully set forth herein.

9 operated in this state by Respondent New Star Smog, upon a finding that Respondent New Star
10 has, or is, engaged in a course of repeated and willful violations of the laws and regulations
11 pertaining to an automotive repair dealer.

12 55. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Test Only
13 Station License No. TC 275916, issued to Respondent New Star Smog, is revoked or suspended
14 following a hearing under this article, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of
15 Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked
16 or suspended by the Director.

17 56. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Inspector
18 License No. EO 146465, issued to Respondent Ramirez, is revoked or suspended following a
19 hearing under this article, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 26
20 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended
21 by the Director.

22 57. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Inspector
23 License No. EO 635598, issued to Respondent Contreras, is revoked or suspended following a
24 hearing under this article, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 26
25 of the Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended
26 by the Director.

27 58. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 44072.8, if Smog Check Inspector
28 License No. EO 634240, issued to Respondent Hahn, is revoked or suspended following a hearing

1 under this article, any additional license issued under Chapter 5 of Part 5 of Division 26 of the
2 Health and Safety Code in the name of said licensee may be likewise revoked or suspended by the
3 Director.

4
5 **DISCIPLINARY CONSIDERATIONS**

6 **Respondent New Star Smog**

7 59. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent New Star
8 Smog, Complainant alleges that on or about December 15, 2014, the Bureau issued Dong Lee
9 d.b.a. New Star Smog Test, an Administrative Citation #C2014-1458, for actions in violation of
10 section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, in that New Star Smog Test unlawfully inspected
11 and certified a Bureau undercover vehicle with a missing/modified Air Injection System. A
12 Citation Service Conference was held on January 22, 2015. A request for a formal appeal was
13 received on February 11, 2015. On August 24, 2016, the appeal was heard. The decision
14 affirming Citation #C2014-1458 became effective January 28, 2017. Payment was received April
15 14, 2017.

16 60. On July 8, 2015, the Bureau issued Dong Lee d.b.a. New Star Smog Test, an
17 Administrative Citation #C2015-1664, for actions in violation of section 44012 of the Health and
18 Safety Code, in that New Star Smog Test unlawfully inspected and certified a Bureau undercover
19 vehicle with a missing/modified Air Injection System. A Citation Service Conference was held on
20 July 28, 2015. A request for a formal appeal was received on August 17, 2015. The decision
21 affirming Citation #2015-1664 by reason of Respondent's default became effective June 24,
22 2018.

23 61. On November 3, 2016, the Bureau issued Dong Lee d.b.a. New Star Smog Test, an
24 Administrative Citation #C2016-1984, for actions in violation of section 44012 of the Health and
25 Safety Code, in that New Star Smog Test unlawfully inspected and certified a vehicle utilizing the
26 BAR 97 when the OBD Inspection System (OIS) was required. A Citation Service Conference
27 was held on December 8, 2016. On November 17, 2017, the appeal was heard. The decision
28 affirming Citation #2016-1984 became effective March 16, 2018.

1 **Respondent Ramirez**

2 62. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Ramirez
3 Complainant alleges that on or about On January 2, 2009, the Bureau issued Frank Ramirez,
4 Administrative Citation #M09-0789. On February 2, 2009, a Citation Service Conference was
5 held. Training was subsequently completed on February 18, 2009.

6 63. On July 8, 2015, the Bureau issued Frank Ramirez, Administrative Citation #M2015-
7 1665, for actions in violation of section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, in that Frank
8 Ramirez unlawfully Smog Check inspected and certified a Bureau undercover vehicle with a
9 missing/modified Air Injection System. A Citation Service Conference was held on July 28,
10 2015. A request for a formal appeal was received on August 17, 2015. On or around January 22,
11 2018, Respondent Ramirez withdrew the request for appeal of Citation #2015-1665 pursuant to a
12 Settlement of Citation agreement effective January 24, 2018. The Citation became effective on
13 April 24, 2018.

14 64. On April 19, 2016, the Bureau issued Frank Ramirez, Administrative Citation
15 #M2016-0824, for actions in violation of section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, in that
16 Frank Ramirez unlawfully Smog Check inspected and certified a vehicle utilizing the BAR 97
17 when the OBD Inspection System (OIS) was required. A Citation Service Conference was held
18 on July 20, 2016. The Decision affirming Citation #M2016-0824 became effective August 21,
19 2016.

20 **Respondent Contreras**

21 65. On December 15, 2014, the Bureau issued Oscar Contreras, Administrative Citation
22 #M2014-1459, for actions in violation of section 44032 of the Health and Safety Code, in that
23 Oscar Contreras unlawfully Smog Check inspected and certified a Bureau undercover vehicle
24 with a missing/modified Air Injection System. A Citation Service Conference was held on
25 January 22, 2015. A request for formal appeal was received on February 11, 2015. On August 24,
26 2016, the appeal was heard. The Decision affirming Citation #M2014-1459 became effective
27 January 28, 2017.

1 **Respondent Hahn**

2 66. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Hahn
3 Complainant alleges that on December 30, 2013, the Bureau issued Ducki Hahn, Administrative
4 Citation #M2014-0411. On January 22, 2014, a Citation Service Conference was held. Training
5 was subsequently completed on February 5, 2014.

6 67. On November 3, 2016, the Bureau issued Ducki Hahn, Administrative Citation
7 #M2016-1985, for actions in violation of section 44012 of the Health and Safety Code, in that
8 Ducki Hahn unlawfully Smog Check inspected and certified a vehicle utilizing the BAR 97 when
9 the OBD Inspection System (OIS) was required. A Citation Service Conference was held on
10 December 8, 2016. A request for a formal appeal was received on December 19, 2016. On
11 November 17, 2017, the appeal was heard. The Decision affirming Citation #M2016-1985
12 became effective March 16, 2018.

14 **PRAYER**

15 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
16 and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

17 1. Revoking or suspending Automotive Repair Dealer Registration Number ARD
18 275916, issued to Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test, Dong U. Lee, President;

19 2. Revoking or suspending Smog Check, Test Only, Station License Number TC
20 275916, issued to Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test, Dong U. Lee, President;

21 3. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 146465, issued
22 to Frank Ramirez;

23 4. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 635598, issued
24 to Oscar Contreras;

25 5. Revoking or suspending Smog Check Inspector License Number EO 634240, issued
26 to Ducki Hahn;

1 6. Revoking or suspending any and all Automotive Repair Dealer Registrations in the
2 name of Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test, Dong U. Lee, President pursuant to section
3 9884.7, subdivision (c), of the Business and Professions Code;

4 7. Revoking or suspending any and all licenses issued under the Motor Vehicle
5 Inspection Program (Health & Saf. Code sec. 44000, et seq.) in the name of Frank Ramirez
6 pursuant to section 44072.8 of the Health and Safety Code;

7 8. Revoking or suspending any and all licenses issued under the Motor Vehicle
8 Inspection Program (Health & Saf. Code sec. 44000, et seq.) in the name of Oscar Contreras
9 pursuant to section 44072.8 of the Health and Safety Code;

10 9. Revoking or suspending any and all licenses issued under the Motor Vehicle
11 Inspection Program (Health & Saf. Code sec. 44000, et seq.) in the name of Ducki Hahn pursuant
12 to section 44072.8 of the Health and Safety Code;

13 10. Ordering Respondents Car Talks Inc. dba New Star Smog Test, Dong U. Lee, Frank
14 Ramirez, Oscar Contreras and Ducki Hahn to pay the Bureau of Automotive Repair the
15 reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and
16 Professions Code section 125.3; and,

17 11. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
